Toddlers explore exciting facets of their world in the **Investigators Classroom!**

In wanting to know the hows and whys of everything around them, your toddler is meant to explore, take apart, put together, and question practically everything. Investigators learn through play, which is developmentally appropriate, so our goal is to create an environment where they can thrive.

Toddlers in the Investigators Classroom will:

- exercise their natural curiosity while being exposed to hands-on activities
- be encouraged to interact with peers to start building social skills
- receive guidance through positive reinforcement
- continue to build fine motor skills and increase language skills
- spend time outdoors, where they can boost gross motor skills and gain more coordination

Learning Moments: begins to greet others and says goodbye; puts weight on legs and begins to walk; uses a pincher grasp to pick items up; plays peek-a-boo and other simple games; stacks two or more blocks; likes to see themselves in a mirror; interacts with others; repeats sounds and starts to say simple words; responds to their name; and looks at book pictures.
